APPLICATION

- 1. The applicant makes application for: hat the Workplace Safety & Insurance Appeals Tribunal WSIAT Decisions 691/05 and 691/05 R, be set aside. That the following be ordered:
 - a) Injury entitlement be granted for the mid and upper back
 - b) Permanent impairment be granted for the mid, & upper back and neck
 - c) That the Suitable Employment and/or Business "SEB of Civil Mechanical and Electrical Engineers 213" and Technical Occupations in Computers and Information Systems 218, both be deemed unsuitable
 - d) That the workers medical restrictions are as stated as follows:
 - i. Lifting: no more than 5kg
 - ii. Carrying: no more than 5kg
 - iii. Pushing/Pulling: No repetitive pushing/pulling weights greater than 10kg
 - iv. Sitting/Standing: Rotate siting standing positions, provide lumbar support stool
 - v. Climbing Stairs & Ladder: as tolerated
 - vi. Kneeling: minimal due to low back effort
 - vii. Crouching & Crawling: Minimal due to low back effort
 - viii. Reaching Forward & Overhead; as tolerated
 - ix. Reaching Bending: minimal repetitive reaching when bent from waist
 - x. Handling: with weight less than 5kg
 - That the worker be compensated for all expenses for his new Labour Market Re-Entry Program LMR program (LMR is commonly known as career training)
 - f) That full benefits be paid for:
 - i. From March 8, 2000 to Prior to the LMR program
 - ii. During the LMR program
 - iii. up to I year after completion of LMR program
- g) Redetermination of FEL award at D1 and R1.
- 2. The grounds for the application are:
- a) That the WSIB and WSIAT did not comply with the Workers' Compensation Insurance Act, RSO 1990. They acted in bad faith under section 88 subsections (2) and (3).
 - i. The WSIB acted in bad faith by failing to comply with WSIB policies in rendering decisions WCB ACT 1990 RSO 1990
 - ii. The WSIB did withhold pertinent information from the worker in regards to the LMR plan selection process
 - iii. The WSIB acted in bad faith by changed crucial facts in the claim file when it suited their interests and in doing so violated Board policy and law
 - iv. The WSIAT acted in bad faith by not following the Workers Compensation Board policies in rendering their decisions Benefit of doubt
 - v. The WSIAT acted in bad faith, by not following and complying with the Ontario Human Rights Code dealing with a person with a prior disability. Part I section (1) of the Ontario Human Rights Code RSO 1990
 - iii. The WSIAT acted in bad faith, by not following and complying with the Ontario Human Rights Code section 10 subsection (3)
- b) The WSIB violated contract law
 - i. when they signed an agreement knowing it contained major discrepancies they later changed the information and terms of the contract
